### This term our theme is:

# Sow, Grow, Farm

Let's grow! A crispy carrot, a luscious lettuce or a tasty tomato. Find out where our food comes from—whether it is from a large farm or a local allotment.

Discover how land in the UK is divided into three different types and what livestock are reared on these farms. You will even learn about modern farming techniques to ensure your food is as fresh as can be!

This project teaches children about the features and characteristics of land use in agricultural regions across the world, including a detailed exploration of significant environmental areas.

As well as English and Maths, the main subjects we will be focussing on within the theme are:

- Geography
- Science (Human Reproduction & Ageing)
- Design and Technology- Eating Seasonally

Other subjects that will be ongoing throughout the year include: Music (ukulele), French, PE, Computing, History, RE, and PSHE.

The 'Love to Read' class novels this term are 'The Secret Garden' by Frances Hodgson Burnett and 'The Lion, the Witch & the Wardrobe' by C.S. Lewis.
